Writing

What will the children learn?

In the final half term, the children will be writing their second non-chronological report of Year 3 linked to our topic learning this half term all about the process of Mummification. The children will be reading "The Secret of Black Rock" by Joe Todd Stanton as inspiration for their own adventure narratives.

What will the children be able to do?

The children will continue to think deeply about the effect they want to have on their reader by using mysterious and suspenseful devices. They will also be able to use the features they have learned about non-chronological reports and apply this understanding to their own writing. <u>What will the children remember?</u> The children will remember the mummification

process they learn during the exciting visit from Portals to the Past and use what they have learned in their writing.
