Writing (AH)

What will the children learn?

The children will be watching a short Pixar film (The Blue Umbrella) as inspiration for their own narratives about making friends for three weeks. The children will then be using skills from Year 2 and write a nonchronological report linked to our topic learning this half term.

What will the children be able to do?

The children will begin to think about writing narratives in 1st person (e.g. I, me, my) rather than 3rd person. They will develop the technical skills of writing and editing a non-chronological report.

What will the children remember?

The children will remember the inspiration film "The Blue Umbrella" and the challenge of writing a narrative from their own point of view in 1st person. The children will also remember information from their Science topic lessons as they will need to apply this learning to their non-chronological reports.

What will the children remember?

Reading

What will the children learn?

Our shared text for this half term will be Leonora Bolt by Lucy Brandt.

The children will read and enjoy the story together as a class, developing their fluency, prediction and summarising skills.

What will the children be able to do?

The children will develop positive attitudes towards reading over a wide range of books.

They will be able to predict what might happen from the text, both stated and implied.

What will the children remember?

They will be able to apply the above skills to a range of books they read.

Maths

What will the children learn?

The children will spend the first three weeks learning about fractions and the final weeks before Easter learning about mass and capacity.

What will the children be able to do?

The children will learn to compare and order unit and non unit fractions. They will also look at fractions on a number line.

The children will then move on to measuring mass in grams and kilograms and learn how to add and subtract mass. They will also measure capacity and volume in millilitres and litres.

What will the children remember?

The children will remember and use the associated vocabulary for fractions and mass and capacity and be able to apply this.
