

Reading

- To read on sight high-frequency words and other familiar words, such as topic and Year 1 Buzz words.
- To continue to develop pleasure in reading, motivation to read, vocabulary and understanding by listening to and discussing a wide range of poems, stories and non-fiction at a level beyond that at which your child can read independently.
- To understand both the books they can already read accurately and fluently and those they listen to by checking that the text makes sense as your child reads and correcting inaccurate reading.
- To understand both the books your child can already read accurately and fluently and those they listen to by discussing the significance of the title and main events.
- To have daily reading opportunities in school and at home.

Geography

- To use geographical vocabulary including: city, town, village, factory, farm, house, office, port, harbour and shop
- To use simple compass directions (North, South, East and West) and locational and directional language [for example, near and far; left and right]
- To describe the location of features and routes on a map Geography
- To use aerial photographs and plan perspectives to recognise landmarks and basic human and physical features; devise a simple map; and use and construct basic symbols in a key
- To use simple fieldwork and observational skills to study the geography of their school and its grounds and the key human and physical features of its surrounding

HRE

- To explain what I like and dislike.
- To understand that I am special.
- To find what makes me unique.
- To notice similarities and differences between people.
- To explain that parts of bodies covered with underwear are private.
- To use the correct names for body parts.

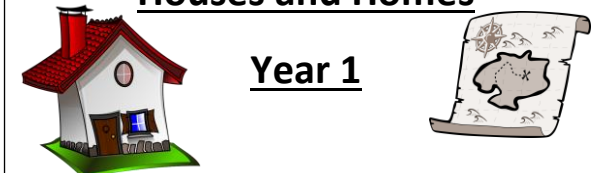
